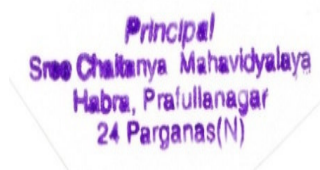

2. The members unanimously resolved that they would open a S.B. Account in any nationalized bank and contribute a nominal amount regularly, so that a fund raising campaign may be kick started to aid the institution voluntarily.
3. The members expressed their concern regarding the escalating pollution and they would undertake a campaign cum awareness programme
